

## **IHSA's *Entry-Level Construction* course recognized by CNESST**

### **Replaces IHSA's *Construction Health and Safety – Basic* course**

February 4, 2022

(TORONTO)—The Infrastructure Health and Safety Association (IHSA) is pleased to announce its *Entry-Level Construction* course is now recognized by the Commission des normes, de l'équité, de la santé et de Sécurité du travail (CNESST) as an equivalent program to the CSSGCC (ASP program), if individuals have also completed Working at Heights and WHMIS training.

Those Ontario workers who wish to work in the Province of Quebec are required to have recognized health and safety training. Recognized training includes IHSA's *Entry-Level Construction*, *WHMIS* and *Working at Heights – Fundamentals of Fall Protection*.

In order to provide the most up-to-date training, IHSA's *Construction Health and Safety Basic* program will be replaced by the *Entry-Level Construction* program as of April 2022. This includes both the in-class program and the *Construction Health and Safety – Basic Home Study* program.
